I. GENERAL CONDITIONS

The Community College District of Jefferson County is requesting Proposal from firms for an External Evaluator on Effective Consortium Practices for the joint evaluation of the CAREERS Workforce cohort at Jefferson College and Ohlone College to be submitted by 2:30 P.M., February 20, 2024, at the College Business Office on the Hillsboro Campus, Attention Kayla Barren, Administrative Assistant. Proposals must be sealed in an envelope and clearly marked on the outside in the lower left-hand corner "Proposal: External Evaluator on Effective Consortium Practices RFP #240012". Failure to comply with this provision of the specification may result in the rejection of the proposal. It is the responsibility of the vendor to confirm the delivery of the proposal at the proper place and time. There will not be exceptions made for proposals delivered late or to the wrong location. Faxed, emailed, or oral proposals will not be accepted.

All proposals are to be F.O.B. Jefferson College/prepaid, delivered and be valid for 60 days after closing date. The Community College District of Jefferson County is a public institution and is exempt for all federal, state and local taxes. Do not include any taxes in the quotation. Jefferson College reserves the right to reject any or all proposals in whole or in part and waive any informality.

Proposal award will be made on or about March 15, 2024, and order will be placed immediately thereafter. Successful firm will be notified of the award and order details will be completed.

II. PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND INTRODUCTION

For the joint evaluation of the CAREERS Workforce cohort at Jefferson College and Ohlone College, an external evaluator will be engaged to provide guidance for project investigators on effective consortium practices. The external evaluator will also be required to provide guidance and evaluate the consortium's high school and college partnerships, provide guidance and evaluate branding and marketing for the Ohlone College Biotechnology Program and provide guidance and evaluate progress on industry partnerships.

This process will commence with a virtual evaluation workshop to present guidance for investigators and faculty on both Jefferson College and Ohlone College campuses. The Year 1 workshop will cover an overview of the evaluation design, methods, and data analysis plan. A midterm Year 2 progress report for the project would include summary joint data collected by the individual institutions. The final Year 3 evaluation report would provide feedback on consortium collaboration effectiveness that would be used to inform future partnerships. Jefferson College in Hillsboro, Missouri and Ohlone College in Fremont, California comprise the Colleges Aligning Resources to Elevate Education and Regional STEM (CAREERS) Workforce consortium that is funded for 3 years by the National Science Foundation (NSF) Enabling Partnerships to Increase Innovation Capacity (EPIIC) grant.

III. COMMENCING AND COMPLETION OF WORK

This project is subject to the Jefferson College Board of Trustees approval of funding on March 14, 2024.

IV. PROJECT ADMINISTRATION

The Dean of Institutional Effectiveness and Equity shall be the College's representative on the project. The Dean shall have the sole authority, after consultation with College Officials, to approve any changes in the scope of the project, specifications or other matters relative to the project.
